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Now is a great time to get your lawn in shape for the cooler months ahead. Although this can be one of the busiest seasons for Fort Worthians, it's the perfect time to take advantage of the moderate

weather and prepare for the winter before the first frost

Landscape, Yard and Garden

• Although grass appears to stop growing in the fall, the roots are actually growing deeper to prepare for winter. Clear leaves from lawn, re-

seed patchy areas, and plant spring flowering bulbs.

 Now is the best time to fertilize your lawn. Use a high phosphorous mix to ensure healthy grass in the spring.

 Prune your trees and shrubs after the leaves turn to encourage healthy growth. • Trim any tree limbs that are dangerously close to power lines or the roof of your house. Snow and ice can cause damage in the winter.

Organize your garage. Clean

freeze and expand breaking the pipes.



 Make sure your roof is in good shape. Inspect for miss-

ing and loose shingles. It's better to proactively deal with repairs in the fall than to discover a leaky roof during a storm.

- Examine your pool cover for damage and replace if necessary.
- Inspect your driveway for cracks. Clean out and repair any damage with driveway filler, then coat with a com-

mercial sealer.

• Check foundation for cracks and caulk around the areas where masonry meets siding and where pipes or wires enter the house. Openings in the structure can cause water to get in and freeze, resulting in cracks and mold build up.

• Prepare your yard equipment for storage. This includes draining fuel from all gas-operated equipment such as lawn mowers, leaf blowers, and chain saws.

• Drain garden hoses and store them inside. Any water left in exterior pipes and faucets can

Recipe of the Month Apple Butter Pork Loin

Ingredients

- 2 (2 pound) boneless pork loin roast
- 1/4 cup brown sugar
- 2 tablespoons water
- · seasoning salt to taste
- 2 cups apple juice
- 1/2 cup apple butter
- 1/4 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1/4 teaspoon ground cloves

Steps

- Preheat the oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C).
- Season the pork loins with seasoning salt, and place them in a 9x13 inch baking dish or small roasting pan. Pour apple juice over the pork, and cover the dish with a lid or aluminum foil.
- **3.** Bake for 1 hour in the preheated

oven. While the pork is roasting, mix together the apple butter, brown sugar, water, cinnamon,

and cloves.

Kids Corner: Fall Wind Chimes



- I. Prep some **balsa wood** strips by puncturing it with this a single hole punch. Older kids can do it themselves but you may want to prepare this for 3-5 year olds.
- 2. Set out some **liquid watercolors** in baby jars and drop different colors on the balsa wood with **droppers**. Then use a **paint brush** to move the color around.
- 3. Paint about the same amount of wood beads in the same way, so you can separate the balsa wood on the wind chimes.
- 4. Once all your beads and balsa wood painted, and dried, string them onto lanyard.
- 5. The last step is to wrap the lanyard to a stick (You can go on a nature hunt for this part!) I wrapped the wood around the stick and then wrapped a piece of wire around that to hold it in place. I did this part for the kids. Older kids can do this easily though. Then they picked the color <u>cord</u> they wanted to hang up the wind chime and I tied it to each side of the stick.

PLAYGROUND SAFETY CHECKLIST

Use this simple checklist to help make sure your local community or school playground is a safe place to play.

Public Playground Safety Checklist

- Make sure surfaces around playground equipment have at least 12 inches of wood chips, mulch, sand, or pea gravel, or are mats made of safety-tested rubber or rubber-like materials.
- Check that protective surfacing extends at least 6 feet in all directions from play equipment. For swings, be sure surfacing extends, in back and front, twice the height of the suspending bar.
- 3. Make sure play structures more than 30 inches high are spaced at least 9 feet apart.
- 4. Check for dangerous hardware, like open "S" hooks or protruding bolt ends.

- Make sure spaces that could trap children, such as openings in guardrails or between ladder rungs, measure less than 3.5 inches or more than 9 inches.
- 6. Check for sharp points or edges in equipment.
- Look out for tripping hazards, like exposed concrete footings, tree stumps, and rocks.
- 8. Make sure elevated surfaces, like platforms and ramps, have guardrails to prevent falls.
- Check playgrounds regularly to see that equipment and surfacing are in good condition.

Carefully supervise children on playgrounds to make sure they're safe. quicker than you might expect.
